Fabric amounts based on yardage that is 42" wide.

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### Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!

## **Cutting Instructions**

#### From Fabric A. cut:

six 4-1/4" x WOF strips. Subcut:

forty-eight 4-1/4" squares

five 4" x WOF strips. Subcut:

forty-eight 4" squares for the HSTs

eight 3-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:

forty-eight 3-1/2" x 6-1/2" rectangles

fourteen 2" x WOF strips. Subcut:

forty-eight 2" x 6-1/2" rectangles

forty-eight 2" x 5" rectangles

#### From each of Fabrics B-M, cut:

one 4" x WOF strip. Subcut:

four 4" squares for the HSTs

Trim the remainder of the strip to 3-1/2" wide, then subcut:

four 3-1/2" squares

one 3-1/4" x WOF strip. Subcut:

four 3-1/4" squares. Mark a diagonal line on the wrong side of each of these squares.

Trim the remainder of the strip to TWO 1-1/4" wide strips, then subcut:

four 1-1/4" x 4-1/4" strips


four 1-1/4" x 5" strips

## From the Binding Fabric, cut:


seven 2-1/2" x WOF strips

## Assemble the Half-Square Triangles (HSTs)

**Step 1:** Pair a 4" Fabric A square with a 4" Fabric B square, RST. Mark a diagonal line on the wrong side of one square. Sew 1/4" away from both sides of the marked line. Cut on the marked line, creating two half-square triangles (HSTs). Press toward the darker fabric. Trim to 3-1/2" square. Repeat to make eight A/B HSTs.



**Step 2:** Repeat Step 1 to make eight HSTs from each of Fabrics C-M, pairing each one with Fabric A.




## Assemble the Block Corner Units

Step 3: Gather: one 3-1/4" Fabric B square one 4-1/4" Fabric A square one 1-1/4" x 4-1/4" Fabric B strip one 1-1/4" x 5" Fabric B strip one 2" x 4-1/4" Fabric A strip one 2" x 6-1/2" Fabric A strip

**Step 4:** Place the 3-1/4" B square RST in one corner of the 4-1/4" Fabric A square, with the marked line oriented as shown here. Sew on the marked line. Trim the seam allowance to 1/4" and press.



**Step 5:** With the completed Step 4 unit oriented as shown, sew the 1-1/4" x 4-1/4" B strip to the bottom edge of the unit. Press. Sew the 1-1/4" x 5" B strip to the right edge. Press. Sew the 2" x 5" A strip to the right edge. Press. Sew the 2" x 6-1/2" A strip to the bottom edge. Press.



The completed Block Corner Unit should measure 6-1/2" square. Repeat to make four Fabric B Block Corner Units.




Step 6: Repeat Steps 3-5 to make four Block Corner Units from each of Fabrics C-M.





#### Assemble the Blocks

#### **Step 7:** Gather:

one Block Corner Unit from each of Fabrics B, C, H and I two HSTs from each of Fabrics B, C, H and I one 3-1/2" square from each of Fabrics B, C, H and I four 3-1/2" x 6-1/2" Fabric A rectangles

Arrange the units as shown. Note the fabric placement and block orientation in the Block Assembly Diagram.

**Step 8:** Sew the HSTs and Fabric A rectangles together, as shown, to make four 6-1/2" square units. Press.




**Step 9:** Sew the four 3-1/2" Fabric B, C, H and I squares together to form a four-patch, using the fabric placement shown in the Block Assembly Diagram.

**Step 10:** Sew the sections together in three rows of three. Press the unit seams toward the completed Step 8 units.


**Step 11:** Sew the rows together, nesting the seams and pressing the seams to one side to form the block.

The completed Block should measure 18-1/2" square. Make four BCHI Blocks.

**Step 12:** Repeat Steps 7-11 to make:




four EDJK Blocks

#### Assemble the Quilt



**Step 13:** Arrange the blocks into four rows of three blocks. Note the fabric placement and block orientation in the Quilt Assembly Diagram.

**Step 14:** Sew the blocks together to form rows. Press the rows to the left in the odd numbered rows and to the right in the even numbered rows.

**Step 15:** Sew the rows together to form the quilt center. Press the row seams open.

Your quilt top is complete! Baste, quilt, bind and enjoy!

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
