## Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!


## Cutting Instructions

Print one copy of Template A and trace to template plastic, or use a $45^{\circ}$ triangle ruler (I used Creative Grids $45^{\circ}$ Kaleidoscope and Dresden Plate Ruler).

## From Fabric A, cut:

one 5 " x WOF strip, then subcut:
four Template 1 triangles

## From Fabric B, cut:

two strips 4" x WOF, then subcut: sixteen squares 4 " $\times 4$ ". Subcut all squares once on the diagonal.

From each of Fabrics C, N, O, Q and T cut:
three 5" x WOF strips, then subcut:
thirty-two Template 1 triangles
From each of Fabrics D, H, I, M and S, cut:
two 5" x WOF strips, then subcut: sixteen Template 1 triangles

## From Fabric E, cut:

two strips 4" x WOF, then subcut:
twelve squares $4 " \times 4$ ". Subcut all squares once on the diagonal.
From each of Fabrics F, L, P, and R, cut:
one strip 4" x WOF, then subcut:
eight squares $4 " \times 4$ ". Subcut all squares once on the diagonal.
From Fabric G, cut:
seventeen 5 " x WOF strips, then subcut:
two hundred fifty-two Template 1 triangles
seven 4" x WOF strips, subcut:
sixty-four squares $4 " \times 4 "$. Subcut all squares once on the diagonal.
From Fabric J, cut:
one strip 4" x WOF, then subcut:
two squares $4 " \times 4$ ". Subcut all squares once on the diagonal.
From Fabric K, cut:
one 5" x WOF strip, then subcut:
eight Template 1 triangles
From the binding fabric, cut:
eight $2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF strips

## Step 1: Make the Kaleidoscope blocks

1. Gather the pieces for Block 1:
four Fabric R triangles
four Fabric H/Template 1 triangles four Fabric G/Template 1 triangles

Sew two Template 1 triangles together, as pictured (fig. 1). Press seams open.
fig. 1
2. Repeat to make four identical triangle units.
3. Sew units together to complete center of block (fig. $2 \& 3$ ).

4. Sew triangles to block corners, as pictured (fig 4). Press seams toward triangles.

5. Trim block to $9-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 9-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$.
6. Repeat Steps 1-5 to make the following blocks (refer to block samples for fabric placement)

## Step 2: Assemble the Quilt


$\square$





1. Arrange the blocks into nine rows of seven blocks. Note the specific block placement in the Quilt Assembly Diagram on page 8.

2: Sew the blocks together to form rows. Press the rows to the left in the odd numbered rows and to the right in the even numbered rows.

3: Sew the rows together to form the quilt center. Press the row seams open.
Your quilt top is complete! Baste, quilt, bind and enjoy!


## Templates

Print at 100\%.
