## Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!


## From each of Fabrics A, D and I, cut:

four 8" x WOF strips. Subcut:
forty 4" x 8" rectangles
From each of Fabrics B, E, H and J cut:
seven 3-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:
twenty $3-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 13^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles
From each of Fabrics C and G, cut:
fourteen 3-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: forty $3-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 13^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles

From each of Fabrics F and K , cut:
two 8" x WOF strips. Subcut:
twenty 4" x 8" rectangles
From the binding fabric, cut:
eight $2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF strips
Assemble the Blocks
Print eighty copies of Template 1
This quilt is constructed using paper piecing for the blocks. Sew the pieces in the order indicated on the templates. Trim seam allowances to $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ as each new piece is added. Tip: Shorten your stitch length in order to make the removal of the paper easier later on.

Step 1: Gather:
one Fabric A rectangle
one Fabric B rectangle
one Fabric C rectangle
one Fabric D rectangle
Paper piece a unit, positioning Fabric A in section 1, Fabric B in section 2, Fabric C in section 3 and Fabric D in section 4. Trim the unit to 8 " square, leaving the paper in place for now. Repeat to make twenty units like this. Set aside for the A Blocks.


Step 2: Gather:
one Fabric A rectangle one Fabric E rectangle one Fabric C rectangle one Fabric D rectangle

Paper piece a unit, positioning Fabric A in section 1, Fabric E in section 2, Fabric C in section 3 and Fabric D in section 4. Trim the unit to 8" square, leaving the paper in place for now. Repeat to make twenty units like this. Set aside for the A Blocks.


Step 3: Gather:
one Fabric F rectangle
one Fabric G rectangle one Fabric H rectangle one Fabric I rectangle

Paper piece a unit, positioning Fabric F in section 1, Fabric G in section 2, Fabric H in section 3 and Fabric I in section 4 . Trim the unit to 8 " square, leaving the paper in place for now. Repeat to make twenty units like this. Set aside for the B Blocks.


Step 4: Gather:
one Fabric K rectangle one Fabric G rectangle one Fabric J rectangle one Fabric I rectangle

Paper piece a unit, positioning Fabric $K$ in section 1, Fabric $G$ in section 2, Fabric J in section 3 and Fabric I in section 4. Trim the unit to 8 " square, leaving the paper in place for now. Repeat to make twenty units like this. Set aside for the B Blocks.


Step 5: Arrange two completed Step 1 and two completed Step 2 units in two rows of two, following the Block Assembly Diagram. Sew the blocks together to form rows, pressing the seams in opposite directions. Sew the rows together, nesting the seams and pressing the seam open or to one side. Remove the paper backing from the block. The block should measure 15-1/2" square.

Repeat to make ten A Blocks.


Step 6: Arrange two completed Step 3 and two completed Step 4 units in two rows of two, following the Block Assembly Diagram. Sew the blocks together to form rows, pressing the seams in opposite directions. Sew the rows together, nesting the seams and pressing the seam open or to one side. Remove the paper backing from the block. The block should measure 15-1/2" square.

Repeat to make ten B Blocks.



Step 7: Arrange the blocks into five rows of four blocks. Note the fabric placement and block orientation in the Quilt Assembly Diagram.

Step 8: Sew the blocks together to form rows. Press the rows to the left in the odd numbered rows and to the right in the even numbered rows.

Step 9: Sew the rows together to form the quilt center. Press the row seams open.
Your quilt top is complete! Baste, quilt, bind and enjoy!

## Alternate Cutting for Warm Colorstory

## From Fabric A, cut:

five 4 " $\times$ WOF strips. Subcut:
twenty-four 4" x 8" rectangles
six 3-1/2" $\times$ WOF strips. Subcut:
sixteen 3-1/2" x $13^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles

## From Fabric B, cut:

five 4" x WOF strips. Subcut:
twenty-four 4" x 8" rectangles

## From Fabric C, cut:

eight 3-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:
twenty-four 3-1/2" x 13" rectangles
four 4" x WOF strips. Subcut: sixteen $4 " \times 8$ " rectangles

From Fabric D, cut:
four 4" x WOF strips. Subcut: sixteen 4" x 8" rectangles

From each of Fabrics E, F, I and J, cut:
seven 3-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:
twenty $3-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 13^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles
From Fabric G, cut:
six 3-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: sixteen 3-1/2" x $13^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles
five 4 " $\times$ WOF strips. Subcut:
twenty-four 4" x 8" rectangles
From Fabric H , cut:
eight 4" $\times$ WOF strips. Subcut: forty 4 " $\times 8$ " rectangles

From Fabric K, cut:
four 4" x WOF strips. Subcut: sixteen 4 " $\times 8$ " rectangles
eight $3-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF strips. Subcut: twenty-four 3-1/2" x 13" rectangles

From the binding fabric, cut:
eight 2-1/2" x WOF strips

## Assemble the Blocks

Follow the instructions for the Cool Colorstory quilt, using the following fabric substitutions to create four block types:

Step 1: Gather:
one 4 " $\times 8$ " Fabric G rectangle one $3-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 13^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric I rectangle one $3-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 13^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric K rectangle one 4 " x 8" Fabric H rectangle

Paper piece a unit, positioning Fabric G in section 1, Fabric I in section 2, Fabric K in section 3 and Fabric $H$ in section 4. Trim the unit to 8 " square, leaving the paper in place for now. Repeat to make twelve units like this. Set aside for the A Blocks.


Step 2: Gather:
one 4" x 8" Fabric G rectangle one $3-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 13^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric J rectangle one $3-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 13^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric K rectangle one 4" x 8" Fabric H rectangle

Paper piece a unit, positioning Fabric G in section 1, Fabric J in section 2, Fabric K in section 3 and Fabric $H$ in section 4 . Trim the unit to 8 " square, leaving the paper in place for now. Repeat to make twelve units like this. Set aside for the A Blocks.


Step 3: Gather:
one 4" x 8" Fabric B rectangle one $3-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 13^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric C rectangle one $3-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 13^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric F rectangle one 4 " x 8 " Fabric A rectangle

Paper piece a unit, positioning Fabric $B$ in section 1, Fabric $C$ in section 2, Fabric F in section 3 and Fabric A in section 4. Trim the unit to 8" square, leaving the paper in place for now. Repeat to make twelve units like this. Set aside for the B Blocks.


Step 4: Gather:
one 4" $\times$ 8" Fabric B rectangle
one $3-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 13^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric C rectangle
one $3-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 13^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric E rectangle one 4 " $\times 8$ " Fabric A rectangle

Paper piece a unit, positioning Fabric B in section 1, Fabric C in section 2, Fabric E in section 3 and Fabric A in section 4. Trim the unit to 8 " square, leaving the paper in place for now. Repeat to make twelve units like this. Set aside for the B Blocks.


Step 5: Gather:
one 4" x 8" Fabric D rectangle one $3-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 13^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric A rectangle one $3-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 13^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric E rectangle one 4 " x 8 " Fabric C rectangle

Paper piece a unit, positioning Fabric $D$ in section 1, Fabric $A$ in section 2, Fabric $E$ in section 3 and Fabric C in section 4. Trim the unit to 8 " square, leaving the paper in place for now. Repeat to make eight units like this. Set aside for the C Blocks.


Step 6: Gather:
one 4" x 8" Fabric D rectangle
one $3-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 13^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric A rectangle
one $3-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 13^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric F rectangle
one 4 " $\times 8^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric C rectangle
Paper piece a unit, positioning Fabric D in section 1, Fabric A in section 2, Fabric F in section 3 and Fabric C in section 4. Trim the unit to 8 " square, leaving the paper in place for now. Repeat to make eight units like this. Set aside for the C Blocks.


Step 7: Gather:
one 4" x 8" Fabric K rectangle
one $3-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 13^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric J rectangle
one $3-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 13^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric G rectangle
one 4 " $\times 8$ " Fabric H rectangle
Paper piece a unit, positioning Fabric $K$ in section 1, Fabric J in section 2, Fabric G in section 3 and Fabric H in section 4 . Trim the unit to 8 " square, leaving the paper in place for now. Repeat to make eight units like this. Set aside for the D Blocks.


Step 8: Gather:
one 4" x 8" Fabric K rectangle
one $3-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 13^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric I rectangle
one $3-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 13^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric G rectangle
one 4 " x 8 " Fabric H rectangle
Paper piece a unit, positioning Fabric $K$ in section 1, Fabric I in section 2, Fabric $G$ in section 3 and Fabric H in section 4 . Trim the unit to 8 " square, leaving the paper in place for now. Repeat to make eight units like this. Set aside for the D Blocks.


Step 9: Arrange two completed Step 1 and two completed Step 2 units in two rows of two, following the Block Assembly Diagram. Sew the blocks together to form rows, pressing the seams in opposite directions. Sew the rows together, nesting the seams and pressing the seam open or to one side. Remove the paper backing from the block. The block should measure 15-1/2" square.

Repeat to make six A Blocks.

Step 10: Arrange two completed Step 3 and two completed Step 4 units in two rows of two, following the Block Assembly Diagram. Sew the blocks together to form rows, pressing the seams in opposite directions. Sew the rows together, nesting the seams and pressing the seam open or to one side. Remove the paper backing from the block. The block should measure 15-1/2" square.

Repeat to make six B Blocks.

Step 11: Arrange two completed Step 5 and two completed Step 6 units in two rows of two, following the Block Assembly Diagram. Sew the blocks together to form rows, pressing the seams in opposite directions. Sew the rows together, nesting the seams and pressing the seam open or to one side. Remove the paper backing from the block. The block should measure 15-1/2" square.

Repeat to make four C Blocks.


Step 12: Arrange two completed Step 7 and two completed Step 8 units in two rows of two, following the Block Assembly Diagram. Sew the blocks together to form rows, pressing the seams in opposite directions. Sew the rows together, nesting the seams and pressing the seam open or to one side. Remove the paper backing from the block. The block should measure 15-1/2" square.

Repeat to make four D Blocks.


Continue quilt construction by following the Cool Colorstory instructions, starting at Step 7.

## Templates

Print 80 copies of Template 1 at $100 \%$.
